## **ORDINANCE NO. 3-2016**

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 7 [FIRE PREVENTION AND FIRE PROTECTION] OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF HOPEWELL TOWNSHIP, YORK COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA

**WHEREAS**, Hopewell Township ("Township") is a Pennsylvania municipality, being a second class township; and

WHEREAS, the Township has adopted a Code of Ordinances (the "Code"); and

**WHEREAS**, the Township adopted Ordinance No. 2002-10 establishing rules and regulations for fire prevention and protection, including the issuing of burning bans in the Township, which has been codified as Chapter 7; and

**WHEREAS**, the purpose of this Ordinance is to amend Chapter 7 of the Code to amend those who may issue the burning ban; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED by the Board of Supervisors of Hopewell Township as follows:

**SECTION 1: Section 7-202 [Burning Ban]** of the Code is hereby amended as follows (additions <u>double-underlined</u>, deletions <del>strikethrough</del>):

- <u>A.</u> The <u>Chairman of the Board of Supervisors is hereby authorized to declare a total or partial burning ban throughout the Township <del>upon motion and majority vote of the Board of Supervisors when, in their the Chairman's</del> discretion, such ban is required for the peace, health, and welfare of the citizens of the Township, and at least one of the following has occurred:</u>
  - 1. The Commonwealth has declared a drought warning or drought emergency.
  - 2. York County has declared a drought warning or drought emergency, or has declared a ban on burning.
  - 3. Upon request of the Fire Chief.

**SECTION 2: Section 7-203 [Duration of Ban]** of the Code is hereby amended by adding the following subsection as follows:

In the event that the Chairman of the Board Supervisors declares a ban on burning pursuant to §7-202, such ban shall remain in effect until lifted upon motion and majority vote of the Board of Supervisors at a public meeting, but may be reviewed by the Board at any public meeting after the meeting at which it imposes the ban. The ban may be lifted or by the same procedure as required for imposing the ban as set out in §7-202.

**SECTION 3:** This Ordinance shall be effective five (5) days after enactment.
